



# BLUENOSE AUTOSPORT CLUB RALLY / SPRINT CHAMPIONSHIP General Competition Rules (GCR)

Effective January 26, 2022

## 1 Championship Events

### 1.1 Types of Rallies Included

- a. Bluenose Autosport Club (BAC) RallySprint - Club level - each event counts toward club level Rally / Sprint Championship points.
- b. BAC Performance Rally - Regional - each event counts toward club level Rally / Sprint Championship points.

## 2 Club Championship

### 2.1 General Requirements

- a. All events for the Championship shall be scheduled in the official BAC Event Calendar each year - [www.bluenoseautosport.ca](http://www.bluenoseautosport.ca);
- b. Overall Championship consists of both a Driver and a Co-Driver;
- c. Driver and Co-driver Championship accumulate points separately;
- d. Must display a BAC sticker on the outside of the vehicle, placed on or near the rear window (on the back quarter of the vehicle).

### 2.2 Championship Eligibility

- a. To qualify for the championship, the competitor must be a full member of BAC or Atlantic Sports Car Club (ASCC). One day memberships do not count toward qualifications of championship awards;
- b. There must be a minimum of two (2) events held for the year-end Championship to be awarded;
- c. To qualify for the Championship, the competitor must compete in at least two (2) eligible events.

## 2.3 Event Coordinator Points

In the case that a competitor is an Event Coordinator or Deputy Coordinator for a BAC event, they may:

- a. Earn points equal to their highest finishing position within that competition year;
- b. Score coordinator points only once within a competition year;
- c. Coordinator points will not be used in a tie-breaker situation.

## 3 Vehicle/Crew/Equipment

### 3.1 Vehicle/Crew/Equipment Eligibility

- a. Eligibility shall be in accordance with the Canadian Association of Rally Sport (CARS) General Competition Rules (GCR's) & National Rally Regulations (NRR).

## 4 Championship Scoring

### 4.1 General

Competitors shall be scored based on their position relative to other eligible members. (example: if the third-place crew is not eligible, the fourth place crew would receive third-place points).

### 4.2 Overall Championship Points

Competitors shall score points individually for the Championship according to the following schedule:

#### *Finishing Position - Points Awarded*

<b>1st - 20 pts</b>	<b>3rd - 12 pts</b>	<b>5th - 8 pts</b>	<b>7th - 4 pts</b>	<b>9th - 2 pts</b>
<b>2nd - 15 pts</b>	<b>4th - 10 pts</b>	<b>6th - 6 pts</b>	<b>8th - 3 pts</b>	<b>10th - 1 pt</b>

### 4.3 Overall Championship

Each competitor's total accumulated points, in accordance with section 4.2, shall be used to score the year-end Championship results. The competitor having the highest number of total points will be declared the winner.

#### **4.4 Tie-Breaker**

In the case of an overall number of points tied for any of the first three positions in the championship, the competitor with the most event wins shall be declared the winner of the tie. If this fails to break the tie, the competitor with the most second-place finishes shall be declared the winner, then again for third-place finishes, until the tie is broken. The final tie-breaker shall be the total number of stage wins within the championship year. Any ties still existing after application of all tie-breakers shall remain as ties.

### **5 Championship Awards**

#### **5.1 Championship Awards**

Awards will be presented each year for the overall championship to the top three finishers.
