Description of the Event

These events will be run on the site of the Middle Stewiacke Mud Slingers Club, using sections of the existing track and the surrounding fields. The course will be level soil and sand base. The course changes every event, and is defined by pylons. The course length ranges between 300-500m long. The site is a field with few obstructions that are easily avoided. A river edges the back limit of the property. Courses and paddocks will be located a minimum of 100 ft from the river, the river is lined by trees so it will not be a safety issue.

Competitors are run one at a time. Once a competitor finishes and has returned to the service area, the next competitor starts. Competitors will run the course for a total of 4 runs.

In the event a competitor stops on course they are visible to the marshals. If help is needed to get their vehicle moving again, or in the event a competitor requires first aid, the start/finish marshal is able to dispatch someone immediately to the competitor to assist.

The event marshals are volunteers and/or competitors from the day of the event. The entire course is visible to the event marshals. The finish marshal is located off the course, and uses a stopwatch to time the event.

Part B: Event Details

Participant Procedures:

Registration and payment must be completed online.

Although not mandated by Nova Scotia COVID restrictions, as these are outdoor venues, face coverings are recommended at Check In and Timing & Scoring, at Driver's Meeting, during Course Walk, and anytime 6 foot social distance cannot be adhered to.

Participants arrive and park in the designated service area. Announce their arrival at Check-in. All participants are to show proof that they have signed the Bluenose Autosport electronic waiver (Speedwaiver). <<https://bluenoseasc.speedwaiver.com/idomw>>

Participants attend the Driver's meeting and then do a walk around of the course.

Participants will wait in the designated service area until it is their turn to compete. Competitors are run one at a time on the course. A competitor is not started until the previous competitor has safely exited the course.

Course Security:

There is one access road to the venue that leads directly to the Parking/ Registration Area. The course is beyond this area with access blocked by pylons and rope fences.

Safety Requirements (Participants):

Waivers are signed online for registration. Participants require at a minimum a Snell M or SA 2005 or newer helmet. Should a vehicle be equipped with a cage, and or harness, a Snell SA 2010 is required. All loose items will be removed from the vehicle prior to starting.

Communication:

No communication devices required for this event as there are no marshals located on the course. The entire event operates from a single point (usually the start location).

Spectators:

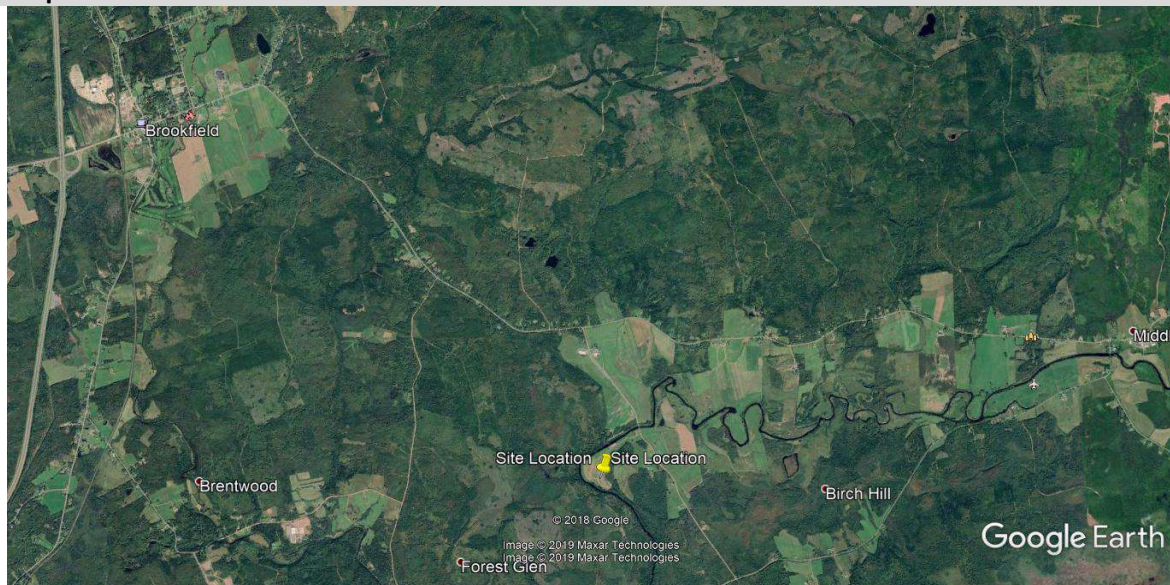
Spectators are not permitted on the course. They are permitted in the service area, and are able to watch the entire event from this location. Face coverings are recommended when social distancing cannot be adhered to.

Media/Filming/Photography:

Any requests for filming/photography are handled on the day of the event, unless contact had been made previous to the event. It is strongly suggested to the filmmaker/photographer to bring and wear a safety vest if they choose a pre-approved (by the organizer) safe spot on the course. Typically however, filming/photography can be completed well off the course in safe areas.

Emergency Details

In the event there is a serious incident. The organizer will call 911, and emergency services will respond. The venue is 20km to Colchester East Hants Health Centre in Truro, so response times are reasonable. The organizer will have the address of the venue to provide to the 911 operators. The organizer will communicate with responders, media and CARS.
